B. Fire Prevention (Johnson/Swarbrick)

Division Chief Mike Pott reported on the transition for Firefighter/Paramedic Brandon McKay into the Fire Prevention Specialist position.

C. El Dorado County Emergency Services Authority-JPA (Swarbrick) (Thomas-alternate)

Chief Hardy reported the District received the actuarial which will allow to accurately base the OPEB retirement health. Chief Hardy stated the JPA was waiting for the actuarial to come back so that the District could charge the JPA for the OPEB retirement health. Chief Hardy stated the District would charge \$217,552 for retired health which in essence is revenue back into the District's budget. Chief Hardy stated he wrote a letter to the JPA Executive Director which was excepted at the finance meeting and was also excepted at the Board level at the last meeting. Chief Hardy stated the draft RFI came back from council with some changes and it was approved at the Board Meeting. Chief Hardy reported that at the next District Board meeting there will be an agenized item for the Board to decide if they would like to enter into an RFI with the JPA to take over any additional medic units besides the four that the District currently has, Chief Hardy reported the Executive Director of the JPA has a contract that is due to expire at the end of May. The Board went into closed session at the last meeting however there was no action taken due to the fact that Tom Keating; head of HR, was not present.

D. Human Resources (Thomas/Courtial)

Director Thomas reported they are in discussions with the non-safety personnel regarding their expired contract.

#### E. Budget and Finance (Thomas/Courtial)

Director Thomas reported that himself as well as Director Courtial, Chief Hardy, and Division Chief Tim Cordero met to discuss the preliminary budget for the 13/14 Fiscal Year. Director Thomas stated it is not complete because they were awaiting some additional numbers but should be able to come back to the next board meeting with a more complete budget.

#### F. Revenue Research Committee (Courtial/Brunton)

Director Brunton stated in discussions with Chief Hardy; they are looking at potentially staffing a water tender during high fire danger days so it would be available if needed and potentially receive some income for their response.

#### 11. FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT:

Chief Hardy stated the emergency activity has really started to increase in the beginning of May. Chief Hardy reported the District sent a local government strike team to the Springs Fire in Ventura County on May 3<sup>rd</sup> and on May 4<sup>th</sup> the District sent an OES state engine to Sunal for initial attack due to the red flag alert down there. Chief Hardy reported on OES 258 replacement with OES 372. Chief Hardy stated he met with Chief Zagaris regarding the replacement OES Engine and Chief Zagaris informed Chief Hardy that he is considering not replacing the Engine. Chief Hardy reported that Chief Gill sent a letter on behalf of the County Chiefs to Chief Zagaris stating their backing for the District to receive the replacement OES Engine. Chief Hardy asked the Board to also send a letter to Chief Zagaris.

It was moved by Director Swarbrick and seconded by Director Courtial to formulate a letter to Chief Zagaris regarding the replacement OES Engine. The motion was passed by the following vote:

Chief Hardy reported an update on the SRA to LRA changes. Chief Hardy reported on 4 conditional job offers for Apprentice Firefighter positions. Chief Hardy announced that Warren Hubbard has formally submitted his paperwork

for retirement and his last day will be May 30<sup>th</sup> and Jason Ertz has accepted a position with Sacramento City Fire, his last day was May 9<sup>th</sup>. Chief Hardy announced the testing process for Division Chief has been completed and Captain Lohan is on the Division Chief's hiring list. Chief Hardy thanked Division Chief Kurt Taylor for heading up the multi-agency RFT 130 Wild Land Refresher.

## 12. BOARD COMMENTS:

Swarbrick: Director Swarbrick thanked the Chiefs and line personnel for all that they do. Director Swarbrick thanked Tom Mahach for always coming to the meetings and representing the residence of Pollock Pines. Director Swarbrick addressed Curt Weidmer by stating that he has read everything that has been submitted and appreciates Mr. Weidmer's opinion but when Mr. Weidmer stated that he doesn't judge Director Swarbrick and then turned around and stated that Director Swarbrick would take a position just for financial gain for the Union, he has judged Director Swarbrick. Director Swarbrick stated his door is always open and Mr. Weidmer is welcome to contact him at any time.

Thomas:

Director Thomas stated that he has been silent on his thoughts regarding current matters because he believes his duties are with the Board in moving forward and working with the District. Director Thomas stated that we have previous board members and an ex-Union President that are still reliving the past in the newspaper and it is candy to the media. Director Thomas stated that they have made multiple headlines with this at the District's expense and it needs to stop. Director Thomas stated that what is not nearly as gripping to the readers is this new board and new executive leadership with the Union and the new Chief. Director Thomas stated the new Board of Directors, the executive board, the Union and the Chief have worked diligently to forge new relationships and having productive and meaningful conversations. Director Thomas stated we could still be participating in the mud slinging but cautiously have chosen not to do this. Director Thomas stated there is so much at stake with employees all the way from the Chief's position to the apprentices and the support staff; they all have families and people that count on them. This new leadership is looking forward at possibilities and opportunities to balance public safety with jobs, families and budgets. Director Thomas stated the conversations that are happening is not Board vs. Union, its not about how much they can hold onto or how much they can get. The conversations they are having are meaningful and productive and sometimes a little heated and they are always respectful. Director Thomas stated it is a new day in this District and we are moving forward with what he considers dignity and grace given all the situations. The E Board,

the Chief and the Directors have no desire to rehash the past with all due respect to the past Directors and he asked to please allow them to move forward with out the disruption and the rederick that goes on in the newspaper. Director Thomas asked to please trust that the Directors, the Chief and the E Board are completely aware of all of the facts of the past and have no intention of repeating them. Director Thomas stated that they are diligently working collectively in the best interest of all of the men and women that serve in this District. Director Thomas stated that the lies, misstatements, half truths and misrepresentations are defiantly still going on in the newspaper and on both sides and without a doubt there were errors and honest mistakes made also on all sides. Director Thomas stated it is clear that there is also an intentional misrepresentations and skewing of the facts on all sides in an attempt to get ones side across. Director Thomas stated what will likely not appear in the newspapers are all the efforts that all sides have made to come together and heal the wounds of the past. The collective conversations have turned to jobs, proactive budgeting and the security of the District and its employees and it has been done in a cooperative matter with the Union and all involved. Director Thomas stated it seems that there is an insatiable appetite to continue the negative conversation; this is sad in the face of the challenges we have before us. Director Thomas asked all those to support us by allowing us to invest our available energy into the challenges ahead and the future of this organization. Director Thomas stated he will be passing this on to the board members that have been sitting in the audience as well as Union.

Courtial: Director Courtial stated it is time to move on.

Johnson: Director Johnson thanked Director Thomas for his comments and he agrees with them. Director Johnson stated his whole career has been

based on the loyalty and brotherhood that you experience in the fire service and with the latest changes that have come in our

Department; he hasn't felt it as powerfully as some may have, but he has felt some of the ramifications from that. Director Johnson stated the fire station where he started his work 37 years ago; he was afraid to go in there because of the reception he may receive. Director Johnson stated he feels one of the things we should be spending our time on is fire based EMS, he feels like it is being threatened in the

County as well as the State.

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

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

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### EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BL DORADO COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT
AND MICHAEL HARDY, FIRE CHIEF

This Agreement ("Agreement"), dated June 20, 2013 ("effective date"), is entered into by and between the EL DORADO COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, by and through its Board of Directors, located at 4040 Carson Road, Camino, California 95709, ("District"), and MICHAEL HARDY ("Fire Chief"), jointly "Parties."

In consideration of the mutual promises made herein, the Parties agree as follows:

### Title and Description of Fire Chief's Duties.

As of the effective date of this Agreement, MICHAEL HARDY shall serve as the Fire Chief for the District. The Fire Chief serves at the pleasure of the District. The Fire Chief shall comply with all terms and conditions set forth herein and will fulfill, to the best of his abilities, all of the duties of Fire Chief.

The general description of the Fire Chief's duties are set forth in the District's Job Description for Fire Chief and shall include adherence to and administration of all policies as adopted by the Board, adherence to and enforcement of applicable federal and state law, local regulations, and the Fire Protection Act of 1987, efficient administration of the affairs of the District, and performance of such other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the District may assign from time to time.

### 2. Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall take effect beginning on the effective date set forth above and shall remain in effect for one (1) year unless terminated as provided below.

This Agreement may be renewed and extended by mutual written consent of the parties.

### Fire Chief's Commitment to District Business.

- (a) The Fire Chief shall work those hours that are necessary to perform his duties and responsibilities, but in no case less than forty (40) hours per week.
- (b) In the event the Fire Chief works an extra duty day for a Division Chief in excess of the Fire Chief's normal forty hours per week, he may receive a stipend equal to twenty-four (24) hours of top step Fire Captain straight time rate. This compensation is not based on hourly compensation or overtime, but shall be considered as a stipend for additional service. Any stipend or other benefit that impacts or voids the exempt status of the Fire Chief under the FLSA shall result in a forfeiture of the stipend so that the exempt status is retained.

EDCFPD/Fire Chief/Hardy Fire Chief Contract 1/2013

- (c) The Fire Chief shall not be entitled to payment of any overtime or compensatory time off, unless the Fire Chief serves on an Incident Management Team, Strike Team or an Over-Head assignment that is billable to the District. The Chief may receive any net additional funds received by the District for the Fire Chief's service. Reimbursement shall occur at such time as the District receives written confirmation from the reimbursing agency. Payment may be made to the Fire Chief without further Board action.
- (d) The Fire Chief will not work for another employer or otherwise engage in any endeavor for profit or remuneration without the prior written authorization of the District. The Fire Chief shall not spend more than eight (8) hours per week in teaching or other non-District connected business without the prior written consent of the District. All such work shall be performed on the Fire Chief's own time and no such activity shall involve an existing vendor or contractor of District or an activity that may be construed as a conflict of interest or time.
- (e) The Fire Chief will schedule his time as appropriate and will, upon request, provide the District an accounting of his time. The Fire Chief will make efforts to attend all Board meetings unless otherwise excused, will give timely notification to the Board when conflicts occur, and will attend such other District functions as are reasonably necessary for the performance of his position or are requested by the District.
- (f) The Fire Chief will at all times conduct himself in such a way as to maintain his public image as a respected public official.

### Policy Statements,

All policy statements regarding the District shall originate from the District. While acting in his professional capacity as Fire Chief, the Fire Chief shall not engage in political debate or become involved in political issues or lobbying activities which are contrary to, or in conflict with, stated District policies. Where a policy of the District is unclear or nonexistent, the Fire Chief must use his discretion and judgment in making representative statements that are in keeping with current District policy.

### Compensation of Fire Chief.

The Fire Chief's salary as of the effective date of this Agreement shall be \$11,362.00 per month. At the end of the Fire Chief's first full year of service, the District shall consider an increase in the Fire Chief's salary.

### 6. Fire Chief's Benefits.

In addition to the salary specified in Section 5 above, the Fire Chief shall be entitled to the benefits and other compensatory items currently extended to Division Chiefs of the District, as follows:

(a) Use of a District-owned vehicle for District business;

- (b) Full reimbursement for all reasonable expenses incurred in the conduct of the duties of the Fire Chief;
- (c) Health, Dental, Vision, Retirement and other insurance and benefits applicable to the Division Chiefs of the District;
- (d) Sick leave in the amount of 4 hours per pay period;
- (e) Vacation leave in the amount of 9.2 hours per pay period;
- (f) Deferred compensation paid by the District in the amount of \$ 0 per month.

### 7. Evaluation,

The District shall use its best efforts to evaluate the Fire Chief's performance at least annually by the end of May of each year and shall work with the Fire Chief to set performance goals and objectives for the ensuing fiscal year.

### Termination without Cause by District.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the District may, upon the giving of ten (10) days notice, terminate this Agreement without cause and demote the Fire Chief to the position of Division Chief. Nothing in this Agreement shall preclude the District from electing, at any time, in its sole and absolute discretion, to terminate the employment of the Fire Chief without cause and demote the Fire Chief to the position of Division Chief under this Section 8.

No action undertaken by the District, including any evaluations undertaken in Section 7 shall entitle the Fire Chief to any hearing, administrative or otherwise, in the event action is taken by the District to terminate this Agreement and demote the Fire Chief to the position of Division Chief under this Section 8. The notice of termination under this Section 8 shall be given to the Fire Chief at least ten (10) days prior to the date of termination and the Fire Chief shall be obligated to perform his duties as Fire Chief during the ten (10) day notice period. Upon termination without cause under this Section 8, the Fire Chief shall be demoted to the position of Division Chief of the District and shall be subject to all rules and requirements of the Division Chiefs. Upon such occurrence, the Fire Chief's salary and other benefits or compensation shall be adjusted to the salary of a Division Chief with commensurate experience. The Fire Chief shall not be subject to probation as a Division Chief. The Fire Chief may only be terminated from permanent employment with the District for cause under Section 9.

### Termination for Cause by District.

This Agreement may be terminated for cause by the District upon a violation by the Fire Chief of the District's rules, regulations or the policy establishing "for cause" disciplinary action to be taken against District employees. In such event, the District Board shall direct legal counsel for the District to prepare the Notice of Intent to Discipline, pursuant to the provisions of the Firefighters Bill of Rights, Government

Code Sections 3250-3262. A "Skelly Hearing" shall be held by either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board. In the event the Skelly Hearing decision is appealed to an arbitrator as provided by District policy, and the decision of the arbitrator is subsequently appealed to the Board, the Board member conducting the Skelly Hearing shall not participate in any such Board hearing.

Nothing in this Section 9 shall preclude the District from terminating the Fire Chief without cause under Section 8. The Fire Chief's election to demote to the rank of Division Chief or to terminate his employment under Section 10 shall not preclude the District from pursuing termination for cause under this Section 9 as appropriate.

### Termination by Fire Chief.

The Fire Chief may elect to terminate his employment with the District or may elect to demote to the position of Division Chief upon providing the District sixty (60) days written notice. Upon an election to demote to the position of Division Chief, the Fire Chief's salary and other benefits and compensation shall be adjusted to the salary of a Division Chief of commensurate experience. The Fire Chief shall not be subject to probation upon his demotion to the position of Division Chief.

### 11. Indemnification.

The District shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Fire Chief against any tort, professional liability claim or demand or other legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the course and scope of the Fire Chief's duties or when representing the District. The District or its insurance carrier shall pay the amount of any valid judgment rendered thereon or may, at its sole discretion, compromise and settle any such claim or suit without recourse to the Fire Chief.

The District shall reimburse the Fire Chief for any reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the Fire Chief in connection with such claims or suits involving the Fire Chief in his professional capacity while acting within the scope of his employment.

This Section 11 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

### Entire Agreement.

This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the employment of the Fire Chief by the District and contains all of the covenants and agreements between the parties with respect to that employment in any manner whatsoever. Each party to this Agreement acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party or anyone acting on behalf of any party that are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding.

### Modifications.

This Agreement may be changed or modified by mutual written agreement of both parties hereto, provided, however, that the party seeking such change shall give not less than forty-five (45) days written notice to the other party of the request for change or modification.

### 14. Severability.

If any provision or any portion thereof contained in this Agreement is held to be unconstitutional, invalid, unenforceable, or otherwise ineffective, the remainder of this Agreement or portion thereof shall be deemed to be severable, shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect. All provisions of District Codes, Ordinances, Resolutions, Rules and Regulations, practices, policies and procedures shall continue in full force and effect during the term of this Agreement.

No part of this Agreement shall abridge the right of the Fire Chief to any entitlement or protection of State law and District makes no waiver of any such entitlement.

### Governing Law and Venue.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, with venue in the County of El Dorado.

The district is required to adopt its 2013-2014 preliminary operating budget prior to July 1st 2013.

Preliminary information from the County indicates that funding in the County of El Dorado should remain flat or neutral for the upcoming fiscal year.

With that said, please find enclosed the Preliminary 2013-2014 Fire Operations Budget in the amount of \$9,163,288.54.

The budget as presented has reductions from FY 2012-2013 budget in the amount of \$1,417,597.47.

The 1.4M reduction is realized, in part, by a reduction in Staff of;

Also, our overtime budget is reduced by \$264,000 due to floating personnel on each shift to cover vacancies due to sick, vacation, etc.

### Introduction:

The El Dorado County Emergency Services Authority (JPA) Board of Directors is inviting all fire agencies with jurisdictional authority currently providing services in CSA 7 (Agencies are limited to: Cameron Park, Cal Fire, Diamond Springs/El Dorado, El Dorado County, El Dorado Hills, Garden Valley, Georgetown, Latrobe, Mosquito, Pioneer, and Rescue Fire Protection Districts) to submit responses to this Requests for Information (RFI) to provide fire based, advanced life support (ALS) ambulance transport services. The intent behind this request is to find solutions for our future financial viability and continued ability to provide high quality patient care and support fire suppression activities.

### Time Line and Filing Instructions:

The period for accepting RFI's will begin on May 16, 2013 and conclude on July 16, 2013. An RFI must be received at the JPA office, 480 Locust Road, Diamond Springs, CA, no later than 1600 hours on July 16, 2013. Please enclose the RFI response in a sealed envelope or box and address it to Marty Hackett, JPA Executive Director.

RFI responses will be opened during a special JPA Board meeting on Tuesday, July 30, 2013 at 0900 hours at the Diamond Springs Fire Station, (Classroom), 501 Main Street, Diamond Springs. All responses will become public at the time opened.

RFI responses will be placed on the Finance Committee's August agenda for Review and Recommendation.

The RFI matter will then be placed on the JPA's Board of Director's August agenda for review and Action.

### General Conditions:

- 1. The member agencies listed above may submit an RFI response.
- The above member agencies may submit an RFI response as a sole provider or as part of a collaborative team.

- c. How currently employed firefighter-paramedics who could be displaced by the new RFI plan would be integrated into the new provider agency(s), subject to the provisions of applicable collective bargaining or other employee agreements, and the procedures for any required meet and confer process.
- d. How the current Administration of the JPA will function and interact with the contracting agency(s).
- e. All personnel must be California State Firefighter 1 certified.
- f. Personnel assigned to a medic unit shall satisfactorily complete all Performance Standards and Standard Company Evolution's required of suppression personnel for the duration of employment based on their Department's polices.

### **Budget Instructions:**

Agencies submitting an RFI response shall list all personnel costs including OPEB obligations. Several expenditures such as professional services, vehicle and equipment maintenance, fuel, medical supplies, dispatch services and insurance were recently combined under the JPA Admin budget along with all fixed asset purchases. An agency shall include in their RFI response costs where an anticipated need exits and is not funded under the JPA Admin budget.

### Chief Kim Zagaris,

The El Dorado County Fire Protection District Board of Directors wish to voice our concerns regarding the re-assignment of OES Engine 258. El Dorado County FD (ECF) has had a long standing positive relationship with Cal EMA (OES) for over 20 years, as well as the Pollock Pines/ Camino FD prior to consolidation an additional 20 prior to that. Over the years the District has provided quality emergency response capabilities to the citizens of California as well as to the nation during large fire sieges in past years.

Consistently ECF has always been able to staff the apparatus whether it was an engine or at one time the HERF unit, in a variety of All Risk applications tasked by OES. District response personnel are of a high caliber in their training and experience to these responses. ECF responders meet and exceed the required qualifications set by OES for response. They meet and exceed the CICCS "certs and quals", meet and exceed the technical rescue requirements and training and bring a high level of professionalism and experience.

You met with Acting Fire Chief Michael Hardy on Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup> 2013 to discuss the reassignment of OES Engine 258. During your conversation, you could not provide any specific violation towards the agreement between ECF and Cal EMA. No documentation of specific acts or performance issues was provided. Your reason for the reassignment of the engine was based on your concern of recent articles in the local small town paper that "reflect badly" upon the District. You also claim to have been contacted by other local departments that voiced their concern. When asked as to whom these agencies with concern were, you refused to share that information. As a show of support, the El Dorado County Fire Chief's Association drafted a letter of support for ECF to maintain Engine 258. To us this demonstrates the cooperative nature of the District with our neighbors and strong working relationships that exist.

In regards to your concerns of the newspaper articles, none of these have any bearing upon the response capabilities of ECF personnel to assist Cal EMA. In early May, OES Engine 258 was able to staff within an hour to be sent to the Bay Area for a wind event staging. Again, this demonstrates the capabilities and commitment of ECF personnel to this endeavor and relationship.

Finally, most concerning in your response to Chief Hardy as to why the engine would need to be reassigned, was that you mentioned the District's Request For Proposal for a Cooperative Fire Service Agreement with CAL FIRE. This action in our opinion should have absolutely no bearing on ECF to staff an OES engine. The RFP is simply the District Board doing it's due diligence in identifying a possible service delivery model during difficult financial times. In reviewing cooperative relationships between Cal EMA and various local fire agencies throughout the state, it is true that there are a number of OES engines belonging to fire agencies that are in Cooperative Fire Agreements with CAL FIRE.

Another observation of the Board, is that there exists numerous other fire service agencies that have OES resources that have had their fair share of "bad press". Many of these agencies issues would be considered far more demeaning, damaging and irresponsible in comparison to those written in our local paper. If this is the litmus test of an agency to maintain an engine or not, then why have not these other agencies had the removal of their engines or other OES resources? It would appear to us that this decision is being made solely for an agenda and is simply arbitrary and capricious in nature.

El Dorado County Fire Protection District would like to remain a provider of service to Cal EMA through the assignment of Engine 258 or its replacement and the cooperative relationship that both agencies have enjoyed over the many years. We intend to stay vigilant on this issue until resolved. We hope that you will reconsider this reassignment of a valuable resource and service.


