During the March 17, 2022, Board of Directors meeting, staff presented several options for the Board to consider with regards to realigning division boundaries. The options presented provided a balancing of the population counts to meet the 10% threshold. The Board elected to support Option #2:

• Adding population to Division 5 utilizing population within the Gold Hill area, from Division 1. Division 2 remains unaffected and reflects the City of Placerville boundaries. This provides a total variance across the divisions of 981.

To move forward with the proposed changes in Division boundaries, the Board will need to adopt Resolution 2022-1, Board of Director's Division Boundaries based on results of the Federal Decennial Census. If the resolution is approved, staff will work with the County elections department to complete the process of realignment.

Staff would recommend the approval of Resolution 2022-1, Board of Director's Division Boundaries based on results of the Federal Decennial Census.

### RESOLUTION 2022-01 OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT APRIL 15, 2022

### RESOLUTION APPROVING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S DIVISION BOUNDARIES BASED ON RESULTS OF THE FEDERAL DECENNIAL CENSUS

**WHEREAS,** the El Dorado County Fire Protection ("District") is represented by the Board of Directors consisting of five Directors elected individually from five Divisions; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Elections Code section 22000, the Board is required to adjust its Division boundaries by resolution no later than April 17, 2022, so that the Divisions are, as far as practicable, equal in population and in compliance with the Voting Rights Act (Title 52, United States Code section 10301) in a process commonly called "redistricting"; and

**WHEREAS,** the federal decennial census was recently completed and the California Department of Finance's Demographic Research Unit released certified redistricting data in August 2021 for use in local public agencies' redistricting; and

**WHEREAS,** approximately equal populations is the most important criteria in considering the Board's Division boundaries, but the Board may also consider (1) topography, (2) geography, (3) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity, and compactness of territory, and (4) community of interests of a Division (Elections Code section 22000(a)); and

**WHEREAS,** the District's staff worked with the El Dorado County Elections/Surveyors Office to review the certified redistricting data and the population and demographics of each Division based on the Divisions' current boundaries, and to present that data and multiple proposals to the Board and the public for adjusting Division boundaries to comply with the Voting Rights Act in light of population changes over the last decade; and

**WHEREAS,** Elections Code section 22001 requires the Board to hold at least one public hearing on a proposal to adjust Division boundaries prior to the public hearing at which the Board votes to approve or defeat the proposal to adjust Division boundaries; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board held public hearings on the present proposal to adjust Division boundaries, attached as **Exhibit A**, as required by Elections Code section 22001 on March 17, 2022, and April 15, 2022, and these meetings were properly noticed in advance as required by law; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has considered the present proposal to adjust Division boundaries (**Exhibit A**) in light of the Voting Rights Act's requirements and also considered the (1) topography, (2) geography, (3) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity, and compactness of territory, and (4) community of interests of the proposed new Division boundaries; and

**WHEREAS,** in compliance with Election Code section 22000(e)(1), the proposed adjustments to Division boundaries contained in **Exhibit A** will not affect the term of office of any Director.

### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The Board hereby adjusts the boundaries of each of the District's five Divisions by adopting the proposed map of Division boundaries attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit A**.
- 3. The order and timing of election of the District's Divisions shall not be changed: Directors shall be elected from Divisions 2 and 3 in 2022, and from Divisions 1, 4, and 5 in 2024.
- 4. The Fire Chief or the Fire Chief's designee is authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution and the newly adopted Division boundaries attached as Exhibit A to the El Dorado County Elections Department and to work with the Elections Department and carry out any other actions necessary to make the new Division boundaries effective for the November 2022 election.



To: El Dorado County Fire Protection District Board of Directors From: DC Paul Lohan Operations Chief/Apparatus Committee RE: Ordering of three new Type 1 Engines

Board of Directors,

Our District is planning to order three new replacement apparatus around July 2022 to replace the existing apparatus that have reached their first out planned use. However, we were informed of a price increase and an extension of build time for these apparatus. The Apparatus Committee held a meeting and is requesting to order three replacement apparatus for E19, E25 and E28 by April 28<sup>th</sup> due to the price increase and build time. Working with the Fire Chief and our Finance Officer we would request that the Board consider and approve the following proposal.

Currently we have \$903,000 in the apparatus fund. Each July we add an additional \$350,000. We have received a proposal from Golden State Fire (Pierce) to prepay for E19 at a cost of \$661,678.89 from the current apparatus fund. This includes all appropriate taxes and the prepayment discount of \$29,822.86. The total cost, for all three, would be \$2,053,916.01. E25 and E28 will cost \$1,392,237.12 and is to be paid at time of delivery with no interest on this order.

This order is currently scheduled to be around a 20 month build which tentatively sets delivery around January 2024. As of January 2024, we will have \$940,000 in the apparatus account. We are planning to request from the County the use of development impact fees totaling 25% of the cost of all apparatus at that time. We would request \$513,479 from those fees. With that it would bring our final payment down to the fund we have in the apparatus account. In addition, we will be requesting to front load the July 2024 funds to the account early to assist in additional equipment purchases for these apparatus.
